



THE 2007 AAIA VISITING PROFESSOR



After holding professorships at Freiburg and Heidelberg Universities, Wolf-Dietrich Niemeier took up the position of Director of the German Archaeological Institute at Athens. A specialist in the Aegean Bronze Age, Professor Niemeier has excavated extensively in Crete, as well as on the Greek mainland, in southern Italy, Israel and Turkey. He is currently director of the German Archaeological Institute excavations at Miletus (Turkey), the Athenian Kerameikos (Greece), Kalapodi (ancient Phokis, Greece) and the Samos Heraion (Greece). Prof Niemeier is widely published and well respected in his field, as evidenced by the many guest lectures he has delivered throughout Germany, the USA, Great Britain, France, Belgium, Denmark, Sweden, Russia, Austria and now Australia as the 2007 AAIA Visiting Professor.

Whilst in Sydney Professor Niemeier will give two public lectures at the University of Sydney.

A Note on Parking at the University of Sydney

Due to the extensive building works associated with 'Campus 2010', parking at the University of Sydney is currently limited. Parking on Eastern Avenue, Barff Road and Fisher Road is no longer available and pressure on spaces around the Main Quadrangle is high. It is suggested you use the Shepherd Street car park behind the Seymour Centre. A complimentary shuttle bus runs from the Shepherd Street parking station to the Main Quadrangle, via Redfern Station, on a continuous loop at about 10-12 minute intervals, until 10.00pm. The bus leaves from Blackwattle Creek Lane at the Shepherd Street Gate (adjacent to the Aeronautical Engineering Building) with set downs at Madsen Building, Manning Road, The Great Hall and Fisher Library. Otherwise the walk is approximately 10-15 minutes.

Alternate parking can be found in the smaller Bosch car park on Western Avenue (opposite Women's College), the area to the left inside the City Road Gate, or off campus at Broadway shopping centre (first 3 hours free) or on Arundel Street.

If travelling by car, we suggest you arrive early to secure a car park and allow for the longer than usual distance from your parking space. Please feel free to drop passengers at the Main Quadrangle prior to parking.

A 'pay and display' system works throughout the University, with ticket machines located widely across campus. After 3pm, rates are \$2 per hour or a \$6 flat rate for the evening. The machines only accept coins.

For disabled parking contact the AAIA in advance and we shall endeavour to have a space reserved near the lecture hall.
